

Dear Sir:

During the thunderstorm of June 7, 1933 the wind attained a maximum (sustained for a 5-minute period) velocity of 36 miles per hour at 5:08 p.m. During the 5-minute period beginning at 5:08 p.m. the extreme velocity (fastest individual wind-mile) was at the rate of 43 miles per hour. Standard Time is used on our records.
