Since addressing you on the 4th Inst^t we have received none of your favors.

We regret to say that the shipment of "Lord Lyndhurst" has been delayed in consequence of the very unfavorable weather which we have been experiencing - For the past twelve days we have had almost incessant rain. The weather however is now improving somewhat and we trust by next mail to have the shipment completed, and to hand you Invoice.

We have now to advise the engagement of 100 Tons on account of the July shipment in the "North East" to New York at \$8 7/8th Ton -

to arrive freely, and prices will probably
be lower.

Freights have declined and the
"Lord Banning" "North East" & "John Gault"
have been chartered for New York, the
former at \$10⁵/₈ and the two latter at
\$10¹/₂ p. Ton.

Exchange on London advanced
after we last wrote, but is again lower,
and we still quote 1/11³/₈ @ 1/11¹/₄ p. R. for
first class Paper.
