Dear Sir

On the 10th Sept. last I forwarded
you an account Current embracing the different items I
had purchased for you on account of the Factory, by w^{ch}
there appears a balance in my favour of \$307.84 — Since
then at the request of our friend Mr. Bauduy the account
has been examined & an error discovered of \$39.85 in the
charge for Copper, a part of which had been got for a Vessel,
but being included in the same bill & paid for at the same
time, the whole was by mistake charged to you — your a/c
has accordingly been credited for the same — The balance
being still unsettled I shall be much obliged to you to re-
mit it to me if as it has remained some time I have added
an interest on the money advanced, which I trust you
will approve of — Annexed you will find a small
statement of the a/c making the amount now due me
