Dear Sirs,

Since writing on the 22nd Ult^o we have received your letter of 17th April.

The "Albert Gallatin" having been laid on for Boston, we have engaged freight in her for 200 tons of saltpetre @ \$12 1/2⁰ ton.

Our saltpetre market has been in a very excited state during the last ten or twelve days and 8/4 @ 8/8 were demanded for 5% refraction owing to the rise telegraphed from London. Few shippers however were willing to purchase at this great advance in the price, in the uncertainty whether the rise will be maintained at home; and the market has receded to near its former position and we have purchased 3 1/2 @ 4% refraction at 8 R.

We are still without credits and purpose, as on the last occasion, drawing upon
